Summary

On February 11, 2021 at approximately 1808 hours, Officer Nawfal Filali encountered an adult male (son) and adult female (mother) during a dispatched call for service. It was determined that the male had caused a disturbance in Walmart, committed a physical act of domestic violence against the female and was verbally aggressive with members of the Kissimmee Fire Department, who were also on scene attempting to render medical assistance to the male. These facts and circumstances would require action from any officer.

Officer Filali attempted to defuse the situation and calm the male, but his attempts failed. In response, the male subject took up a stance perceived by Officer Filali to be ***aggressive physical resistance***.



“Aggressive Physical Resistance”

As defined by General Order 401.03(e), Aggressive Physical Resistance is when *the subject makes overt, hostile, attacking movements that may cause injury, but are not likely to cause death or great bodily harm to the police officer or others to include the subject causing the threat.*



Officer Filai's Response to Resistance

Officer Filali justifiably responded to the subject's actions by deploying his CEW (taser) at the male. The initial deployment caused the male to go to the ground on one knee.

Officer Filali then delivered a second cycle from his CEW.



Response to Resistance Investigation

Each time an officer responds to resistance, in this instance by deploying a CEW, it requires an independent investigation. This investigation is handled by a supervisor that was not involved in the response and is reviewed through the officer's chain of command, to include the Training Unit.

During review, Officer Filali's second CEW deployment was determined to be unnecessary as the subject's level of resistance decreased after the initial deployment.

General Order 401.02 requires the following- **As the level of resistance decreases, the officer shall deescalate their response level to the minimum force necessary to control the subject and gain compliance.**



Kissimmee Police Department Standards of Conduct General Order 201.02(k)- Obedience to Policies and Procedures, General Orders, and Other Written Directives

Although Officer Filali was lawfully present and justified to utilize his CEW (use force) during his encounter with the male, it was only appropriate for him to deliver a single cycle, not two.

With agency general order requirements that place an emphasis on officer de-escalation, an internal investigation was completed to address the supervisor's concerns from the response to resistance investigation.



IA 21-006 Findings

Officer Filali was found to be in violation of G.O. 201.02(k), Obedience to Policies and Procedures, General Orders, and other Written Directives.

Disciplinary action was taken and Officer Filali was issued a **Written Reprimand**.

Summary

On May 29, 2021 at approximately 2357 hours, Officer Brienna Brown made the decision to perform a traffic stop on a vehicle for a traffic infraction. The circumstances of the stop and radio transmissions heard by on-duty supervision left concerns that Officer Brown may have been engaged in an unauthorized pursuit. The events were shared with Captain Succi, who had similar concerns, so an Initial Notice of Inquiry was completed and an internal investigation was authorized by the Chief of Police.

General Order 402.01 (Vehicle Pursuit) *states- officers may engage in a pursuit when they have reasonable suspicion a fleeing suspect has committed or has attempted to commit a violent forcible felony.*



Identified Violent Forcible Felony by Policy

- Murder;
- Manslaughter;
- Armed robbery;
- Armed sexual battery;
- Arson to a structure reasonably believed to be occupied;
- Use of explosive devices to a structure reasonably believed to be occupied;
- Kidnapping;
- Armed carjacking;
- Burglary armed with a firearm;
- Aggravated assault on a law enforcement officer with a deadly weapon (firearm, edged weapon); does not include a motor vehicle; or,
- Aggravated battery on a law enforcement officer resulting in serious injury.



IA 21-011 (Investigative Findings)

- It was learned through video surveillance, red light camera surveillance, GPS data, police radio transmissions and internal affairs' interviews that:
 - Officer Brown followed the vehicle during her attempted stop for approximately 2.58 miles over a 4 minute and 11 second timeframe.
- Officer Brown acknowledged:
 - the suspect had not committed or had attempted to commit a violent forcible felony;
 - based on the erratic driving pattern of the vehicle and her use of emergency lights, the occupants were aware of her presence;
 - speeds had reached approximately 86 MPH ; and
 - that she was ordered over the police radio to discontinue her actions by on-duty supervision.



IA 21-011 Findings

Officer Brown was found to be in violation of G.O. 201.02(k), Obedience to Policies and Procedures, General Orders, and other Written Directives.

Disciplinary action was taken and Officer Brown received an 8-hour suspension and 4-hours of remedial training.

Response to Resistance

Summary

- Officer Wooten and Officer Acevedo were wearing their department issued class B uniforms and operating marked patrol vehicles when they were dispatched to a call for service involving a disorder.
- Upon their arrival, a naked male subject began to run at them while holding a large kitchen knife in his right hand and a large kitchen knife in his left hand.
- As the subject ran at Officer Wooten and Officer Acevedo, he repeatedly shouted “*Shoot me!*”



Summary

- As the subject grew closer, he threw the knives to the ground. He continued his aggressive approach towards the officers and stopped in front of them.
- Both officers provided verbal commands for the subject to place himself on the ground, but he refused.
- Officer Wooten successfully deployed her CEW at the subject and allowed a full 5-second cycle to be delivered. This achieved Nuero-Muscular Incapacitation (NMI), causing the subject to fall onto his back.
- Officer Acevedo immediately approached and applied handcuffs to the subject.



Response to Resistance Investigation

- Each time an officer responds to resistance, in this instance by deploying a CEW, it requires an independent investigation. This investigation is handled by a supervisor that was not involved in the response and is reviewed through the officer's chain of command, to include the Training Unit.
- The independent review of this incident concluded that the officers were justified in their response to the subject's resistance.
- Additionally, officers employed de-escalation techniques through verbal commands prior to the use of force and placed the subject into a recovery position while waiting for medical personnel to arrive.

Summary of Initial Complaint

Sergeant Raquel Fernandez alleged that on August 29, 2021, at approximately 0500 hours, Officer Corina Garcia violated General Order 201.08(h); Handling Money, Property, and Evidence, when she misplaced prisoner property.

On October 28, 2021, the Internal Affairs Unit received the Initial Notice of Inquiry from Chief Jeffrey O'Dell. On October 28, 2021, I notified Officer Garcia, via e-mail, of the pending investigation and she was provided with her Officer Bill of Rights. Officer Garcia was advised she should not discuss the investigation with any individual except for those privileged communications guaranteed by Florida State Statute.

Allegation of Employee Misconduct form

Sydney Dillon completed a statement, which provided the following information:

"On the evening of 8/29/2021, I was arrested and in Officer Garcia's custody. I was wearing a brown and gold Gucci headscarf while in the back of the vehicle, and it slipped off of my head onto the back of the seat. Before heading into the processing center, I exited the vehicle and informed her that my scarf was in the seat, then asked her to bring it inside along with my cellphone and other belongings, which she agreed to. She escorted me inside the building to get booked and processed, but never retrieved the scarf while inside the holding area. I was incarcerated for a couple of days, then got released and the scarf never turned up along with my other belongings. I contacted Sgt. Perez about the matter in hopes of retrieving the scarf. A few days later, Officer Garcia called me informing me that she lost the scarf and doesn't know where it could be. I believe she kept my scarf in her possession and neglected to turn it in. The value of the scarf is \$390.00"

On November 5, 2021, I spoke with Ms. Dillon over the telephone. Ms. Dillon declined to participate in a recorded interview, as she felt her written statement was sufficient for the investigation.

Summary of Internal Affairs Interviews

Officer Mario Lewis - Witness

On November 2, 2021, at 1954 hours, I met with Officer Lewis, on duty, at the Kissimmee Police Department within the Internal Affairs Office, for an interview. I read the witness advisement concerning perjury and placed Officer Lewis under oath.

Officer Lewis responded to a domestic violence incident with Officer Garcia. Officer Garcia

developed probable cause and arrested Ms. Dillon. Officer Lewis remembered seeing a headscarf on Ms. Dillon's head, but it was not removed from Ms. Dillon's head prior to transport to the Osceola County Jail. Officer Lewis was uncertain what happened to the headscarf.

I concluded the interview at 1958 hours.

Sergeant Moises Perez - Witness

On November 3, 2021, at 1035 hours, I met with Sergeant Perez, on duty, at the Kissimmee Police Department within the Internal Affairs Office, for an interview. I read the witness advisement concerning perjury and placed Sergeant Perez under oath.

Sergeant Perez spoke with Ms. Dillon, who advised him that her headscarf was missing after her release from jail. While at the jail, Ms. Dillon remembered telling Officer Garcia that her headscarf was in the back of the patrol vehicle. Sergeant Perez watched body-worn camera (BWC) video and determined Ms. Dillon was sitting in the back of Officer Garcia's patrol vehicle with the headscarf on her head. Sergeant Perez asked Officer Garcia to check her vehicle for the headscarf and to contact Ms. Dillon. Officer Garcia spoke with Ms. Dillon, as directed by Sergeant Perez, but he did not speak with Ms. Dillon again until a month later. Ms. Dillon said she had a family emergency and advised Sergeant Perez when she spoke with Officer Garcia, it was determined Officer Garcia lost the headscarf, and she wanted to file a complaint. Ms. Dillon responded to the police department and completed an allegation of employee misconduct (AEM) form, which he forwarded to Officer Garcia's supervisor, Sergeant Fernandez. Sergeant Perez did not speak with Officer Garcia any further about the complaint.

I concluded the interview at 1045 hours.

Sergeant Raquel Fernandez - Witness

On November 2, 2021, at 2054 hours, I met with Sergeant Fernandez, on duty, at the Kissimmee Police Department within the Internal Affairs Office, for an interview. I read the witness advisement concerning perjury and placed Sergeant Fernandez under oath.

Sergeant Fernandez received an allegation of employee misconduct form from Sergeant Perez and completed the Initial Notice of Inquiry. Sergeant Fernandez never spoke with Ms. Dillon or any other individual about the incident.

I concluded the interview at 2058 hours.

Officer Corina Garcia - Principal

On November 10, 2021, at approximately 1658 hours, Officer Corina Garcia reported to the Internal Affairs Office, while on duty, without representation. I read the subject advisement to Officer Garcia and proceeded to place her under oath. I provided Officer Garcia with the entire case file for IA 21-016 for her review. No information of material facts relevant to the investigation was intentionally kept from Officer Garcia's attention and review. At approximately 1706 hours, Officer Garcia started her evidence review. At approximately 1737 hours, Officer Garcia completed the evidence review and did not have any questions or concerns before the interview process.

Officer Garcia met with Ms. Dillon during a domestic violence call for service. During the investigation, Ms. Dillon was arrested for domestic battery and placed in the back of her patrol vehicle. Officer Garcia confirmed a headscarf was on Ms. Dillon's head prior to the transport. While at the jail, Ms. Dillon mentioned her missing headscarf to Officer Garcia, but Officer Garcia did not go to her patrol vehicle to look for or retrieve it. Officer Garcia checked the back of her patrol vehicle during her next shift but did not recall seeing the headscarf. Officer Garcia could not be certain when the headscarf fell off Ms. Dillon but advised she is responsible for all prisoner property once an individual is arrested.

Officer Garcia was provided with a copy of Standards for Police Department Conduct, General Order 201.08(h); Handling Money, Property, and Evidence during her audio-recorded interview. Officer Garcia reviewed and acknowledged reading this General Order, and advised she violated this policy.

I concluded the interview at 1749 hours.

Summary of Investigation

Sergeant Raquel Fernandez alleged that on August 29, 2021, at approximately 0500 hours, Officer Corina Garcia violated General Order 201.08(h); Handling Money, Property, and Evidence, when she misplaced prisoner property.

I reviewed Ms. Dillon's complaint indicating Officer Garcia lost her headscarf, valued at \$390.00 after she was arrested and transported to the Osceola County Jail. I spoke with Ms. Dillon, who advised she did not require a recorded interview as her written statement was sufficient for the investigation.

I conducted interviews with Officer Lewis, Sergeant Perez, and Sergeant Fernandez. Neither Officer Lewis nor Officer Garcia removed Ms. Dillon's headscarf prior to her transport to the jail. Sergeant Perez spoke with Ms. Dillon, who advised she was missing her headscarf after she was arrested by Officer Garcia. Ms. Dillon completed a statement on an AEM form and Sergeant Perez completed a Supervisory Response form, which he forwarded to Officer Garcia's supervisor, Sergeant Fernandez. Sergeant Fernandez received the AEM and completed the Initial Notice of Inquiry.

I reviewed BWC footage for the domestic violence incident. At the 29:17 timestamp of Officer Lewis' video, I observed Officer Garcia place Ms. Dillon inside her patrol vehicle. Ms. Dillon had a headscarf on her head while being placed inside the patrol vehicle. Officer Garcia did not have any body-worn camera video of the transport to jail or Ms. Dillon being escorted into the Osceola County Jail.

I reviewed Officer Garcia's domestic violence incident report (21-006896), which did not list Ms. Dillon's headscarf within the property or evidence sections of her report.

I spoke with Osceola County Corrections Internal Affairs Sergeant, Brett Burger. Sergeant Burger advised video of Officer Garcia bringing Ms. Dillon into their facility had lapsed and was no longer available. Sergeant Burger provided me with a detailed list and pictures of the items the Osceola County Corrections Officers took custody of during Ms. Dillon's booking procedure. Ms. Dillon's

headscarf was not listed on her property sheet. I also reviewed Ms. Dillon's booking photo, which did not include her headscarf.

Officer Garcia signed General Order 201, Standards for Police Department Conduct on July 17, 2019, at 13:43 hours. The General Order that Officer Garcia allegedly violated was 201.08(h); Handling of Money, Property, and Evidence. This General Order is located on page seventeen (17) of twenty-two (22).

I conducted an interview with Officer Garcia. Officer Garcia met with Ms. Dillon during a domestic violence call for service. During the investigation, Ms. Dillon was arrested for domestic battery and placed in the back of Officer Garcia's patrol vehicle. Officer Garcia confirmed a headscarf was on Ms. Dillon's head prior to the transport. While inside the jail, Ms. Dillon mentioned her missing headscarf to Officer Garcia, but she did not go to her patrol vehicle to retrieve it. Officer Garcia checked the back of her patrol vehicle during her next shift but did not recall seeing the headscarf. Officer Garcia could not be certain when the headscarf fell off Ms. Dillon but advised she is responsible for all prisoner property once an individual is arrested.

Officer Garcia was provided with a copy of Standards for Police Department Conduct, General Order 201.08(h); Handling of Money, Property, and Evidence during her audio-recorded interview. Officer Garcia reviewed and acknowledged reading this General Order and advised she violated this policy.

Conclusion/Findings

Allegation 1: Violation of Kissimmee Police Department Standards of Conduct General Order 201.08(h); Handling of Money, Property, and Evidence

GO 201.08(h) states: *"All money and evidence coming into the possession of any employee of the Department through the normal course of police duty, which is not the employee's own, shall be delivered to the Evidence Section of the Department or to a superior officer, and the necessary reports shall be made of the transaction before the end of the current tour of duty. Employees shall adhere to all Department directives for further procedures when processing property and evidence. Donations through fundraising activities made to the Department shall be handled in accordance with City Policy."*

Accused: Officer Corina Garcia #847

Complainant: Sergeant Raquel Fernandez #391

Findings: **SUSTAINED**

During this investigation, it was determined that Officer Garcia placed Ms. Dillon inside of her patrol vehicle for transport to the Osceola County Jail. Ms. Dillon was wearing a headscarf prior to the transport. Upon arrival to the Osceola County Jail, Ms. Dillon informed Officer Garcia that the headscarf was inside the patrol vehicle and asked Officer Garcia to retrieve it. According to Ms. Dillon, Officer Garcia did not retrieve the headscarf. A review of Osceola County Jail records did not reveal Ms. Dillon wearing her headscarf during her booking photo, and the headscarf was not placed into her property bin when she was booked into the jail. A review of Kissimmee Police Department case 21-006896 did not show the headscarf being entered in evidence for safekeeping. On her own admission, Officer Garcia advised she is responsible for all prisoner property and

failed to secure Ms. Dillon's headscarf. Based on the totality of the circumstances, there is more than a preponderance of evidence to show that Officer Garcia violated General Order 201.08(h); Handling Money, Property, and Evidence, when she failed to properly secure and handle Ms. Dillon's property before, during and after her arrest.

Under penalties of perjury, I declare that I have read the foregoing document that the facts stated in it are true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

I, the undersigned, do hereby swear, under penalty of perjury, that, to the best of my personal knowledge, information and belief, I have not knowingly or willfully deprived or allowed another to deprive the subject of the investigation of any of the rights contained in ss. 112.532 and 112.533, Florida State Statutes. [F.S.S. 112.533]

KISSIMMEE POLICE DEPARTMENT
General Order 405

The officer should monitor the subject carefully and obtain medical care for any person who requests it, or for any person who demonstrates symptoms inconsistent with the activity, resistance level or conditions surrounding the incident.

When the arrestee is turned over to the detention facility, any unusual circumstances, requests for medical treatment, or actual medical treatment shall be made known to the receiving officer.

405.08 Transportation Procedures: Vehicles designed for prisoner transportation, such as the prisoner transport van or caged unit, shall be used for prisoner transport. Prisoners shall be transported with consideration given to the employee's safety, the prisoner's welfare and the prevention of escape.

Anyone who is under arrest, detained or transported in a Department vehicle shall be completely searched for any weapons or contraband. If the person to be transported is not under arrest and they refuse to be searched, the transport shall be denied unless approved by a supervisor.

To control contraband and safeguard mislaid property, vehicles used for transport shall be examined at the beginning of each shift, and searched prior to and immediately after transporting a prisoner.

Any employee receiving custody of a prisoner from another employee shall search the prisoner before placing him in a Department vehicle.

Arresting officers shall request that an officer of the same sex as the prisoner conduct the search. If this is not practical, the prisoner shall be handcuffed with his hands behind his back and a modified "pat-down" search conducted. Officers conducting a search of a member of the opposite sex should, when practical, have a second officer witness the search.

Purses, backpacks or other similar articles shall be taken from the prisoner at the time of the arrest. The articles shall be searched incident to arrest or processed for safekeeping.

Employees are responsible for the safety of their prisoners and the safekeeping of their property.

The transfer or delivery of a prisoner to an adult or juvenile correctional facility shall be documented in the Charging Affidavit. The transfer or delivery of a prisoner to a medical facility or to other law enforcement agents shall be documented in a Police Incident Report.

Prior to releasing prisoners to another Department employee or an employee from an outside agency, the arresting officer shall notify the receiver of any information regarding prisoners who are combative, suicidal or who pose special security risks. Information relating to these special conditions shall be noted on the last line of the Charging Affidavit and the Police Incident Report.

record the 30 seconds of "pre-event". Audio is not normally captured during this pre-event recording unless the recording was initiated by the gunshot sensor.

Recording can only be stopped by manually pressing the "Stop" button. The employee shall choose from the list of provided recording types to best classify and tag the recording.

Employees shall activate the BWC/PVC prior to arriving on scene of a dispatched call for service, self-initiating law enforcement-related encounters and activities, even when working an off-duty assignment in uniform or whenever there is a potential for dealing with a suspect of a crime or any concern of officer safety. Examples of law enforcement-related encounters include but are not limited to, traffic stops, detentions, consensual encounters of suspicious persons, arrests, searches, interrogations or interviews, and pursuits.

Employees may inform subjects when they are being recorded, if they believe it would help to diffuse a situation. The subject's consent is not required to continue the recording.

Employees are not required to activate the BWC/PVC during interactions with crime victims, witnesses, and members of the community who wish to report or discuss criminal activity. Employees should balance the value of obtaining a recording with the possible reluctance of a victim or witness to provide information while being recorded. Employees shall not use a recorded statement on the BWC/PVC in lieu of a written statement.

When the BWC/PVC is actively recording a police contact, traffic infraction or criminal activity, it shall not be stopped until the contact has ended and the citizen or employee has left the scene.

In contacts that result in arrest, the BWC shall stay activated until the suspect has entered the Osceola County Jail.

If the BWC is not activated and an encounter with a person starts to become adversarial, the employee shall attempt to activate the camera.

Employees providing assistance to other law enforcement agencies will notify them that the incident is being recorded.

Employees are not required to wear a BWC when attending training, court, funerals, award ceremonies, or any other event that is approved by their supervisors.

The Support Services Division Captain shall serve as the BWC/PVC Coordinator.

432.03 Prohibitions: Prohibitions of BWC/PVC use are as follows:

Only authorized personnel to whom a recording system is assigned may use, touch, or handle that recording system. Unauthorized personnel shall not use, touch, or handle any recording

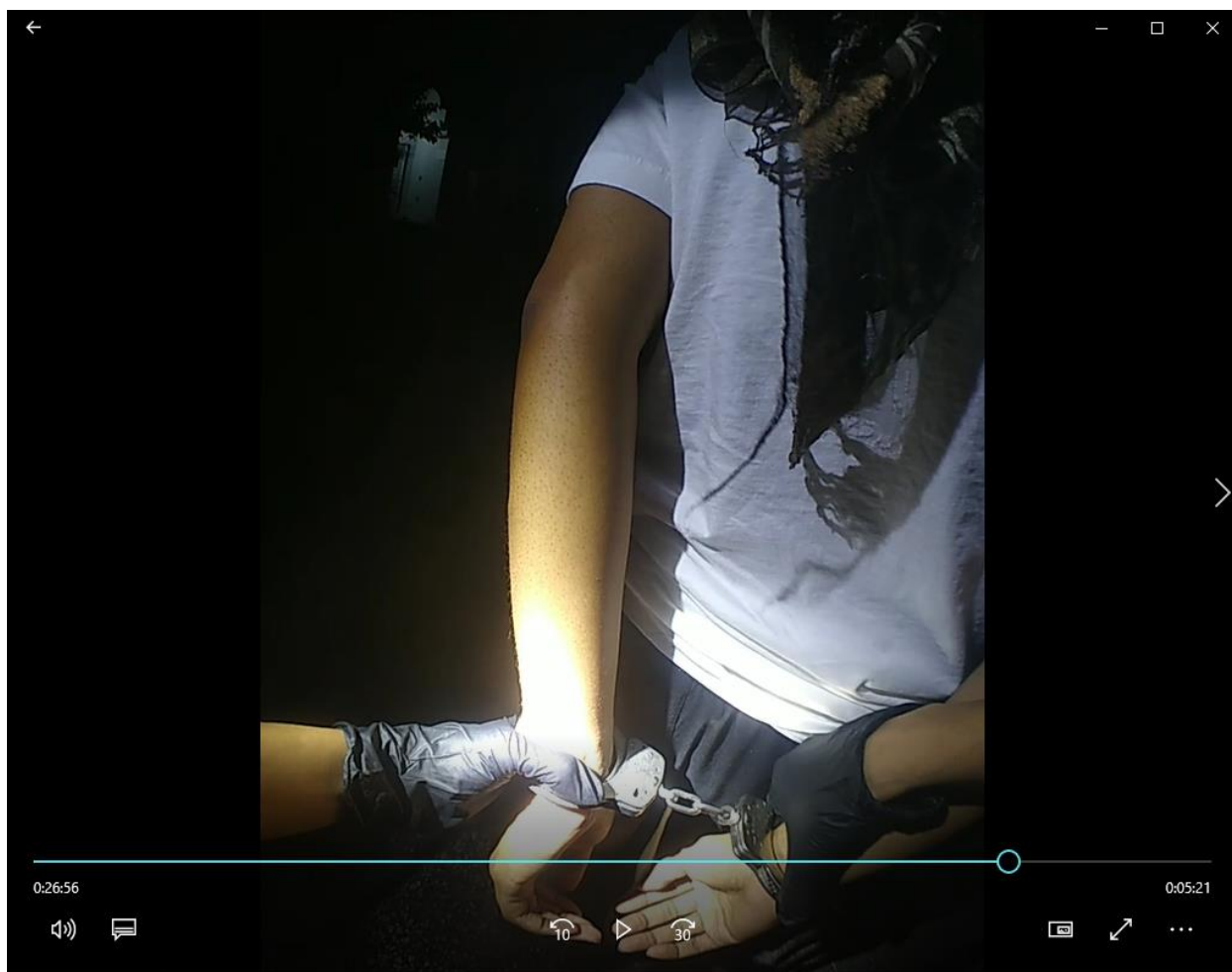

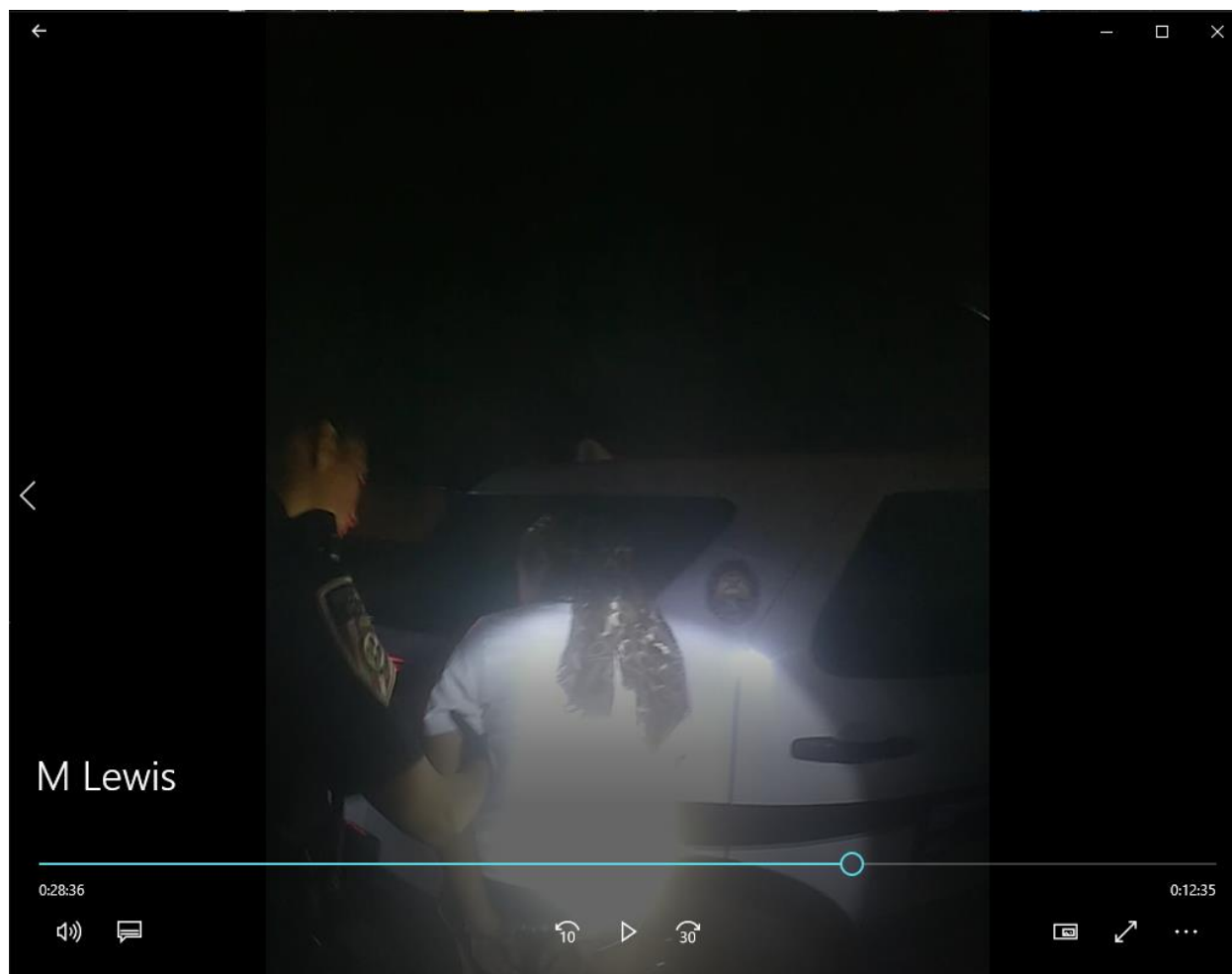
correctional officer, unless extreme circumstances exist where this regulation becomes impractical. Activities of persons taken into custody shall be monitored at all times. Every effort will be made to ensure prisoners/detainees do not injure themselves or cause property damage.

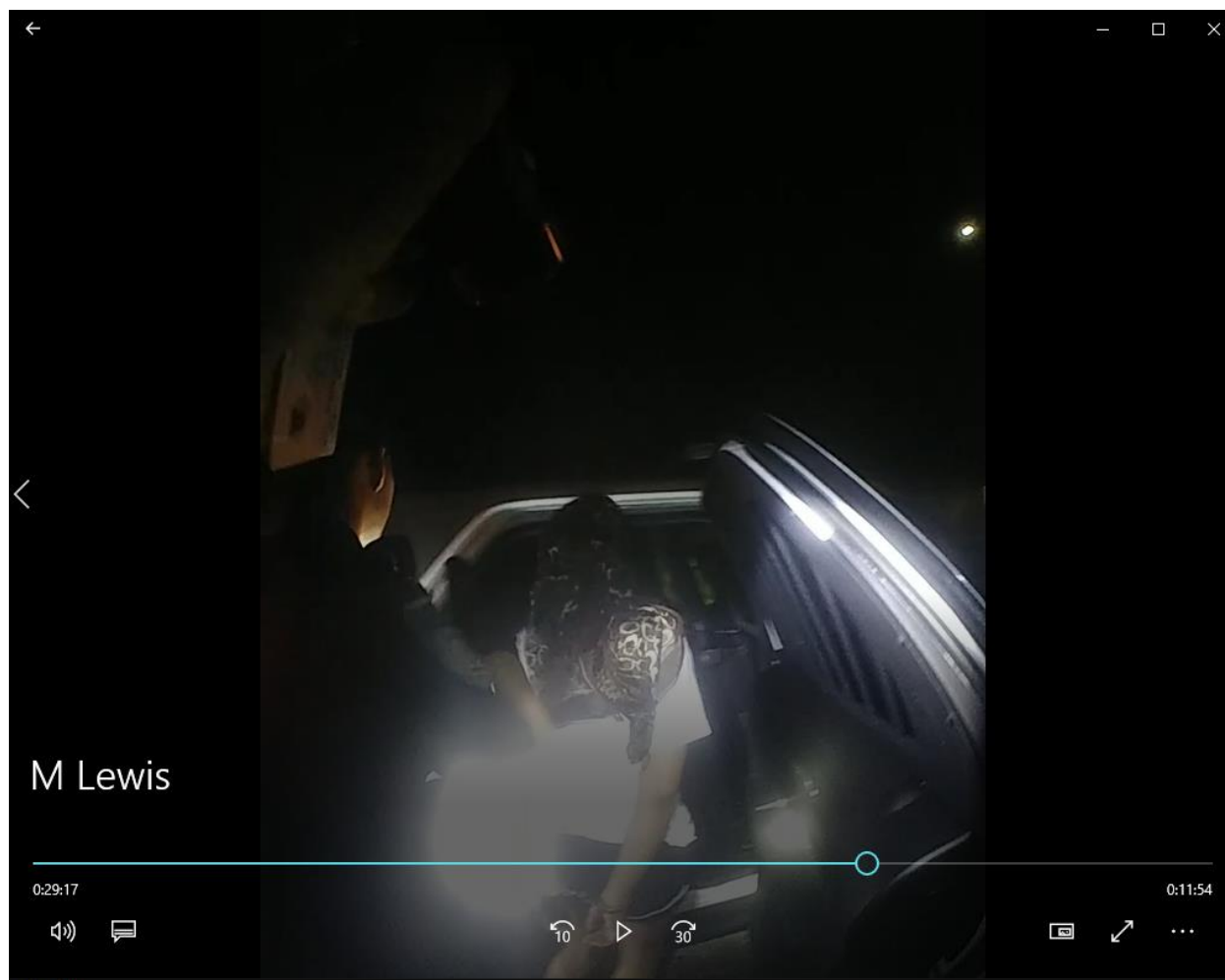
In the event a transporting officer observes any activity that requires police action, the officer shall notify the Communications Center immediately for assignment of another unit. If the transporting officer deems that an emergency exists and delay of action would create unreasonable risk or injury to the general public, the officer should attempt to obtain supervisory approval prior to taking action; however, under no circumstances will the prisoner/detainee be placed in a potentially hazardous situation or left unattended.

- e. *Deadly Force:* Members of the Department shall, at all times, exhaust every other reasonable means of apprehension before resorting to the use of deadly force. The use of deadly force shall be in accordance with current Department directives.
- f. *Resisting Arrest Charges:* When resistance is encountered by members of the Department while affecting a lawful arrest and restraining measures or other force is employed in overcoming such resistance, arresting officers shall place the additional charge of "Resisting Arrest" upon such arrestee. Whenever a member of the Department has occasion to place the charge of "Resisting Arrest" against any person, they shall immediately file a written report of the incident. Resisting arrest charges shall be disposed of by judicial process only.
- g. *Injured Prisoners:* An unconscious or seriously ill or injured prisoner/detainee shall be removed to a hospital. Employees of the Department shall promptly report to their immediate supervisor any person in their care or custody who is in such condition as to require medical attention and shall promptly summon medical aid.
- h. *Handling Money, Property, and Evidence:* All money and evidence coming into the possession of any employee of the Department through the normal course of police duty, which is not the employee's own, shall be delivered to the Evidence Section of the Department or to a superior officer, and the necessary reports shall be made of the transaction before the end of the current tour of duty. Employees shall adhere to all Department directives for further procedures when processing property and evidence. Donations through fundraising activities made to the Department shall be handled in accordance with City Policy.
- i. *Identification as a Police Officer:* Except where impractical or unfeasible, or where the identity is obvious, officers shall identify themselves by displaying the official identification card before taking police action.

Comments: On 1/5/2022, Officers David Toro and Michael Marion responded to 10 South John Young Parkway (Circle K) in reference to an armed disorder. The call stated there was a male who was throwing a brick at a vehicle and damaging a trash can around the store. When Officer Toro arrived he observed the suspect. Officer Toro was walking towards the suspect and that is when he saw the suspect holding a knife to his own neck. Officer Toro told the suspect to drop the knife and that is when the suspect took off running towards Lily Street. Officer Toro feared for the safety of the suspect and others so he gave a description and a direction of travel for the suspect. Officers Marion and Cornier observed the subject run through 1420 and 1422 Emmett Street. The suspect began jumping a fence that led to 1517 Emmett Street. Officer Cornier then yelled to the suspect to come out. The suspect then opened the door to 1517 Emmett Street and went inside and then ran through the apartment, coming out the front door and continuing through the courtyard. Officer Cornier and Officer Marion caught up to the suspect in the side yard of 1535 Emmett Street. The suspect stopped and again raised the knife to his neck. His back was turned to Officer Marion and Officer Cornier. Both Officer Marion and Officer Cornier were giving the suspect verbal commands to drop his knife and get on the ground. The suspect failed to comply while walking backwards towards both Officer Marion and Officer Cornier, pressing the knife into his neck. The entire time he was holding the knife to his neck with both hands. Officer Cornier gave the verbal command that he was going to deploy his Sage weapon. The suspect still did not comply so Officer Cornier deployed the Sage hitting the subject in the back of his left leg. The impact did not stop the suspect from walking back towards them so Officer Marion deployed his CEW which caused the suspect to fall to the ground. Officer Toro then came over and handcuffed the suspect without further incident. Due to the suspect's actions and being hit by the sage round, the Kissimmee Fire Department responded and transported him to the Osceola Regional Hospital where he was placed under a Baker Act.

I responded to the scene during the incident and investigated the response to resistance. The suspect had superficial wounds to his neck from the knife he was holding.

I spoke to Officer Marion, Officer Cornier, and Officer Toro and they all provided me with consistent details as above.

I checked the area for witnesses but no one observed the actual response to resistance.

I responded to Osceola Regional where I made contact with the suspect. The suspect stated he has been having mental episodes and he does not remember what happened at the Circle K. He also told me he is always wanting to hurt himself. The suspect understood the officers were just doing their job and he did not complain of any injuries or mistreatment. I did not observe any significant injuries on the suspect.

After speaking with the officers involved, I reviewed the body camera footage of the incident. All the footage and statements coincided with what was documented in their reports.

My investigation revealed that Officer Toro had probable cause to make contact with the suspect due to the criminal mischief. When Officer Toro went to make contact with the suspect the suspect put a knife to his neck. The suspect then took off running and ran into another person's apartment. When he came out and he again took off running. The suspect then had the knife to his neck again with two hands and continued walking back towards officers. The suspect was hit with a Sage round and when that was ineffective he was subsequently Tased. I find that the officers' response was appropriate and within department guidelines and general orders.

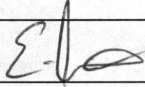

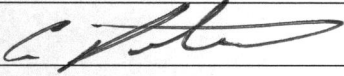

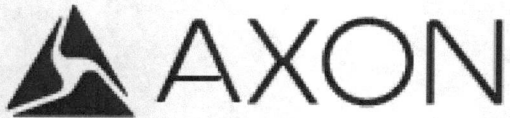

On 01/05/2022, at approximately 1507 hours, I, Officer Toro ID 725, responded to 10 South John Young Parkway, Circle K, in reference to an armed disorder, later turned out to be a baker act.

Upon arrival, I made contact with a store clerk, unknown name, and I asked for the victim who had their vehicle damaged. The store clerk informed me that she was not sure, but she pointed to the back of Circle K, and said there is a male walking around that needs assistance, due to a mental illness. I drove to the south side of the Circle K parking lot, and I observed someone pointing to the intersection of Bryan Street, and Lilly Street. I observed a white male, later identified by his Florida Identification card as Alexander Edward Bokalitz. Alexander started running away from me when I caught up to him at the intersection, and he pointed the sharp end of a pocketknife to the right side of his neck and said, "If you come towards me I will kill myself." I pointed my department issued handgun at Alexander and he then proceeded to run behind 1301 Bryan Street. I lost visual contact of Alexander, but he was later located 1535 Emmett Street. See Officer Cornier's and Officer Marion's supplement for their involvement. I detained Alexander and the Kissimmee Fire Department (run # 220000214) arrived on scene to assess Alexander.

Officers made contact with several callers at 10 South John Young Parkway. One of the callers, later identified by his Florida Driver's License as Justus Jeanbatiste, provided a verbal and sworn written statement to the following: Justus stated Alexander walked out of the Circle K and he kicked over a garbage bin. Alexander then punched the front hood to Justus' vehicle several times and proceeded to kick the driver side mirror.

Contact was also made with the store manager, later identified by her Florida Driver's License as Stephanie Rose Miller, who provided a verbal and sworn written statement to the following: Stephanie stated Alexander entered Circle K and upon exiting, he started throwing thrash bins outside of the property. Stephanie then observed Alexander throwing bricks all over.

I took photos of the scene where Alexander was Apprehended, and of Alexander's self inflicted laceration to the right side of his neck. The photos were submitted into evidence.com.

Based on Alexander's actions and mental illness, he is unable to determine for himself whether examination is necessary and there is substantial likelihood that without care or treatment, Alexander will cause serious bodily harm to himself. KFD later transported Alexander to Osceola Regional Medical Center where he was placed under a baker act.

This report will be inactive and forwarded to records.

On January 5, 2022, at 1508 hours, Officer D. Toro and I, Officer M. Marion were dispatched to 10 South John Young Parkway, in reference to an armed disorder.

Officer Toro arrived on scene first and advised he was behind the location with a male matching the description, who was holding a knife to his throat. The male was later identified as Alexander Edward Bokalitz. I arrived on scene shortly after and Officer Toro advised Alexander ran northbound behind 1307 Lilly Street. I circled around the block and found Alexander running northbound between houses towards West Emmett Street. Alexander hid for a moment then resurfaced running northbound across West Emmett Street and hopped the fence into the backyard of 1517 West Emmett Street. A female and male (NOI) came out of the home and stated that Alexander ran through their living room towards the front of the house. Officer J. Cornier, Officer Toro, and I gave chase on foot westbound next to 1517 West Emmett Street. Officer Cornier and I caught up to Alexander next to 1535 West Emmett Street. Alexander stopped on the south side of the house and placed the knife to the right side of his neck using both of his hands. I gave verbal commands telling the Alexander to "drop the knife." Officer Cornier was also giving verbal commands. Alexander had his back facing Officer Cornier and I as he started walking backwards towards our direction closing the distance between Officer Cornier and myself. Alexander was pushing downward on the knife and yelling, "Kill me." Officer Cornier then delivered one SAGE less lethal round striking Alexander in the left leg. The round did not have any affect on Alexander being that he continued to hold the knife to his neck and was still walking backwards towards Officer Cornier and myself. Since Alexander was still actively resisting, I deployed my department issued Conducted Electrical Weapon (CEW) and aimed it at the center of Alexander's back. Prior to firing the CEW, I yelled "taser, taser, taser," and fired it striking Alexander in the center of his back. The CEW was affective and Alexander experienced Neuromuscular Incapacitation (NMI) causing him to fall backwards onto the ground. Alexander was then placed into handcuffs by Officer Cornier and Officer Toro. (Reference Officer Cornier and Officer Toro's reports for further information.)

I collected the silver foldable knife that Alexander had in his hand and later submitted it into Evidence at The Kissimmee Police Department (KPD).

The probes were removed from Alexander's back and I placed them inside of the spent cartridge. I later submitted the probes and spent cartridge into Evidence at KPD. (Cartridge Serial #: C6208FPTD.)

This supplemental report was completed to document my involvement with this case and will be forwarded to Records.

On January 5, 2022, at approximately 1512 hours, I, Officer Cornier 851 responded to the area of Lilly St/Emmett St in reference to an armed disorder. Officer Toro transmitted, via radio, that the subject was in possession of a knife, and placed it against his own neck.

Upon arrival, unknown subjects, flagged me down, stating the male subject is running west on Emmett St, from S Alden St. As I turned west on Emmett from S Alden St, I immediately saw the subject, Alexander Edward Bokalitz, wearing a blue shirt, black pants, with a knife in his right hand. He ran through the property of 1420 W Emmett and 1422 W Emmett St. At this time, I exit my patrol vehicle (PD 700), and grabbed my Kissimmee Police Department issued "Sage" (less-lethal weapon). I chose to grab my "sage" due to the subject being armed with a knife, and to attempt to resolve this matter with less-lethal force. He jumped the fence that separates 1422 W Emmett St and 1517 W Emmett St. I yelled to Alexander to come out. He then opened the back door to 1517 W Emmett St, entering the location, and ran through the front door continuing west through the courtyard. The resident to the location came outside and stated he ran through her house to the front.

I jumped the fence, continuing my foot pursuit. As I began to catch up to Alexander, I yelled "GET ON THE GROUND, GET ON THE GROUND, PUT IT DOWN". Alexander was on the side of 1535 W Emmett St when I caught up to him. Alexander stopped running, and his back was towards me. He placed the knife to the right side of his neck with his right hand, and began to walk backwards, towards my direction, closing the distance. As he continued to close the distance, he began to push the knife down with both hands, cutting his neck. At this time, I yelled, "SAGE DEPLOYED". I pulled the trigger. One of the less-lethal rounds struck Alexander on the back of the left leg. He was still in possession of the knife, and closing the distance. At this time, Officer Marion 710, deployed his Taser. Alexander fell to the ground (grass area), and was detained without further incident.
