Approval to annex approximately 1.19 acres of property located east of Old Vineland, and north of W. Vine St.

City Attorney Sanchez de Fuentes read Proposed Ordinance #3059 by title.

Planner Brenda Ryan provided an overview of the property to be annexed. She clarified that when the City considers annexations, its only assessing whether the property is abutting City property, and this particular property does. After holding the Public Hearing staff recommends approval.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 3050 KNOWN AS THE ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE CITY OF KISSIMMEE, FLORIDA, UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF FLORIDA STATUTE 163.3184; DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO AMEND THE COMPREHENSIVE LAND USE PLAN AS HEREIN PROVIDED AFTER THE PASSAGE OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING AS REQUIRED BY LAW; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

Recommendation of approval of a Land Use Plan Amendment (LUPA) to change the Future Land Use Map designation from County Low Density Residential (LDR) to City Multi Family Medium Density Residential (MF-MDR), on 1.19 acres of land east of Old Vineland Road, north of W. Irlo Bronson Memorial Highway, and west of Yates Rd.

City Attorney Sanchez de Fuentes read Proposed Ordinance #3060 by title.

Planner Ryan provided information on the proposed land use changes from County Low Density Residential to City Multi-family Medium Density Residential, and explained the designation would support duplex, tri-plex, or multi-family residential developments which is consistent with surrounding property. After holding the Public Hearing staff recommends approval.

Mayor Gonzalez announced the Public Hearing with no response from the audience.

Commissioner Castano moved to adopt Ordinance #3060. Commissioner Fisher seconded the motion.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 3034 KNOWN AS THE CITY OF KISSIMMEE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE, REZONING THE PROPERTY HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

Recommendation of approval of a Zoning Map Amendment (ZMA) to change the zoning designation from County Medium Density Residential (RM-3) to City Neighborhood Open (T4-0) on 1.19 acres of land east of Old Vineland Road, north of W. Irlo Bronson Memorial Highway, and west of Yates Rd.

City Attorney Sanchez de Fuentes read Proposed Ordinance #3061 by title.

Planner Ryan detailed the recommended changes to the zoning designation that would continue to support the transitional development in the area. The applicant plans to develop residential which is consistent with preexisting development. After holding the Public Hearing staff recommends approval.

Mayor Gonzalez announced the Public Hearing with no response from the audience.

Commissioner Fisher moved to adopt Ordinance #3061. Commissioner Castano seconded the motion.

5. PUBLIC HEARINGS

5.A Public Hearing - Resolutions adopting Substantial Amendments to the CDBG 2019-2020, 2020-2021, and 2021-2022 Annual Action Plans

Approval of the City of Kissimmee Substantial Amendment to the CDBG 2019-2020, 2020-2021, and 2021-2022 Annual Action Plans and adopt the accompanying Resolutions.

Frances DeJesus, Development Services, detailed the HUD requirements for transitional projects as described in the agenda item and indicated substantial amendments were needed for compliance. Staff recommends amending the current plans and transferring funds from previous projects to new projects that include single family rehabilitations and ADA compliant side walks and facilities improvements for fiscal years 2019 – 2022. The 2020-2025 Consolidated Plan is also being updated to reflect the changes.

Mayor Gonzalez announced the Public Hearing with no response from the audience.

Commissioner Fisher made a motion to Adopt Resolution #10-22 (PY2019/2020), #11-2022 (PY2020/2021), and #12-2022 (PY2021/2022) and approve the Public Hearing. Commissioner Castano seconded the motion.

Approval of a PUD Amendment updating the sign standards for the Advent Health PUD.

Planner Ryan discussed proposed signage changes to the Advent Heath campus in efforts to further assist with the hospital's expansion. Staff recommends approval with one (1) condition: 1) This amendment does not affect any other design or use standards. Those standards not identified in the sign package shall be governed by the Land Development Code.

Commissioner Fisher made a motion to approve the Public Hearing. Commissioner Castano seconded the motion.
