Acceptance of additional funding from the Florida Department of Transportation Alert Today Florida's High Visibility Enforcement for Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Program

Request

Approval to authorize the Chief of Police to execute Amendment No. 1 to Letter of Agreement and Contract (Grant HIGHVIS25) with the Institute of Police Technology to accept grant funding from the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Alert Today Florida's High Visibility Enforcement for Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Program.

Explanation

The Kissimmee Police Department has been identified as a priority agency within Osceola County, which has the highest representation of traffic crashes resulting in serious or fatal injuries to pedestrians and bicyclists. As a result, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has allocated overtime reimbursement funding to the City in the amount of \$16,648.87 to assist with High Visibility Enforcement efforts. The commission previously approved the \$16,648.87, and we are requesting approval to accept the additional \$4,000.00. These funds will be under agreement with the University of North Florida – Institute of Police Technology and Management.

Financial Summary:

Monthly invoicing will be done for overtime expenses to be reimbursed during the grant period, up to \$20,648.87. \$16,648.87 was received from the original contract and an additional \$4,000.00 will be granted to the Department. This additional funding is offered to the City of Kissimmee. No application process is completed, only acceptance.

Permanent Right-of-Way Easement between TRJ 4030 Kissimmee LLC and the City of Kissimmee

Request

Request approval of a Permanent Right-of-Way Easement between TRJ 4030 Kissimmee LLC and the City of Kissimmee to accommodate streetscape zone requirements on Hoagland Boulevard (Contract #20260069).

Explanation

Due to the lack of right-of-way to accommodate adequate streetscape zones along streets within the Form Based Code (FBC) area of the City, some projects are required to dedicate an easement on private property to the city to accommodate sidewalks and a furnishing zone (green space). This property, 4030 W. Vine, is being platted (SR-24-0006) and the new sidewalk and green space will be required with any new development. This right-of-way easement has varying measurements in width on Hoagland Blvd.

FINDINGS AND REASONS:

Compliance with Land Development Code Section 14-5-5(E), Streetscape Zone, which requires an easement dedication if there is not sufficient space in the existing right-of-way to accommodate the streetscape zones.

Explanation

The 2026 Event & Festival Calendar represents a vibrant and diverse series of cultural and historical celebrations held at the Kissimmee Lakefront Park and Downtown Kissimmee. The series is comprised of:

- Nine (9) festivals provided by the Parks and Recreation Events & Venues Division, including: Martin Luther King Unity Festival, Kissimmee Art in the Park, Kowtown, Taste of Kissimmee, PrideFest Kissimmee, Juneteenth, Monumental Fourth of July, Fandom, and Festival of Lights.
- Four (4) events produced by third-party organizations that have qualified as Signature Events include: Caribbean Fusion, Viva Osceola, Boo on Broadway, and Kissimmee/Orlando Japan Festival.
- One (1) additional event: Veterans Parade — this parade is produced by Osceola County Veterans Council (OCVC) between St. Cloud and Kissimmee every other year. St. Cloud recently announced it will host its own Veterans Day event. Therefore, the OCVC will work with the City of Kissimmee to provide an annual parade and celebration beginning in 11/2026.

The complete Event and Festival Series Calendar, with brief descriptions of each, is in the attachment. The month for each event/festival is confirmed, and the specific date and time are subject to change.

Request

Approval to accept and record a non-exclusive sidewalk easement granted by Osceola-Kissimmee Development IV, LLC. over tracts 1 thru 3 of Osceola Village Center Commercial and Apartment for public sidewalk purposes. (Contract #: 20260057)

Explanation

Osceola-Kissimmee Development IV, LLC. owns property within tracts 1 thru 3 of Osceola Village Center Commercial and Apartment, a subdivision recorded in Plat Book 36, Pages 35–38, of the Public Records of Osceola County, Florida. The City has been granted a perpetual, non-exclusive easement for public sidewalk purposes, including related customary improvements, like curb, gutter, and bike path, as described in Exhibit A.

This easement lies along the southeast side of South John Young Parkway within the Osceola Village Center Commercial and Apartments frontage, tracts 1 thru 3.

Request

Approval to accept the Easement and Maintenance Agreement granted by PINNACLE AT THE WESLEYAN, LLC. tracts B and C of Shingle Creek Plaza, consistent with site plan approval for Pinnacle at the Wesleyan. (Contract #: 20260058)

Explanation

PINNACLE AT THE WESLEYAN, LLC. owns Lot 3 within Shingle Creek Plaza (Plat Book 7, Page 2, Public Records of Osceola County). As part of site plan approval for the Pinnacle at the Wesleyan multifamily development (aka “The Cove”) (DRC# 21-00090), the developer installed paving, sidewalk, and landscaping within adjacent City-owned Tracts B and C.

The City has negotiated and received an Easement and Maintenance Agreement granting a non-exclusive maintenance easement over the maintenance easement area, as described in legal description and sketch, as shown on exhibit B. The Grantee will be responsible for ongoing maintenance of the permitted improvements. The agreement will be recorded following Commission approval.

ITEM 7.K

Knightsbridge Phase 2C & 2D subdivision final acceptance

Request

Request acceptance of subdivision improvements for Knightsbridge Phase 2C & 2D, with conditions.

Explanation

The developer, Lennar Homes, LLC., is requesting acceptance of the subdivision improvements for Knightsbridge Phase 2C & 2D (DRC# SR-22-0014). Construction has been deemed substantially complete, with conditions, with all inspections conducted and finalized in accordance with the City's subdivision site improvement, inspection, and certification procedures (LDC §14-3-43).

Conditions of Approval. The sidewalk segment between Lots 247, 248, 259, and 260 was not constructed because the common sidewalk would have been placed on private property with an easement rather than within a dedicated tract, which the developer prefers. Accordingly, no building permits for Lots 247, 248, 259, or 260 shall be issued until: (1) the pedestrian sidewalk is redesigned to be located within a dedicated tract, approved by City staff, constructed, and inspected; and (2) a replat is recorded creating a 10-foot-wide sidewalk tract, with any necessary side lot line adjustments. The performance guarantee shall remain in effect until these improvements have been constructed and inspected.

The fee-simple subdivision is located at the end of Golden Knight Boulevard. Required improvements with this development include paving, grading, drainage, water, sewer, landscaping, amenities, and street lighting. The subdivision roads, ponds, and open-space tracts have been dedicated to and will be maintained by the Knightsbridge Community Development District and Knightsbridge Master Property Owners Association, Inc., as applicable. The owner has posted a maintenance bond in the amount of \$454,079.75 to ensure the satisfactory condition of the required subdivision improvements for a period of one year from formal acceptance by the City Commission.

The City Commission previously approved the final plat, along with a performance guarantee, for this subdivision (DRC# SR-23-0007) on May 21, 2024.

ITEM 8.A

Memorandum of Understanding with Kissimmee Airport Development Company, LLC

Request

Approval of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Kissimmee Airport Development Company, LLC (KADC) to develop and manage certain real property located at the airport consisting of approximately 119.9 acres of land on the southeast border of the airport, contract # 20260044.

Explanation

The Kissimmee Gateway Airport includes property once used as the Kissimmee Municipal Golf Course. Financial difficulties by the operator resulted in its closure by the City in 2018. The recently approved Airport Layout Plan provides an FAA-approved conceptual plan to redevelop the property focusing on aviation businesses creating quality jobs and a positive economic impact for the community.

In recent years, the airport has been visited by aircraft manufacturers interested in locating operations to Kissimmee. However, due to the lack of infrastructure and utilities at the former golf course site, our responses did not meet their schedules and requirements. This places the property at an unfair disadvantage when competing against other airport sites.

The airport has been approached by two companies offering to provide master development services to improve the property. After completing discussions and evaluations, they lacked either experience, funding or had unrealistic expectations. KADC has approached the City/Airport and has demonstrated they possess the experience and resources to move forward with master development services.

KADC is requesting an MOU to begin preliminary services to include surveying, environmental, conceptual plans for storm water management, master grading and utilities. This work will determine the development of a term sheet / agreement for next steps for site development, marketing and leasing to future businesses. The first phase of the work is anticipated to be completed by the end of the first quarter of 2026. There is no cost to the City/Airport for these services.

A representative from KADC will be available to provide an introduction and answer any questions that the Commission might have.
